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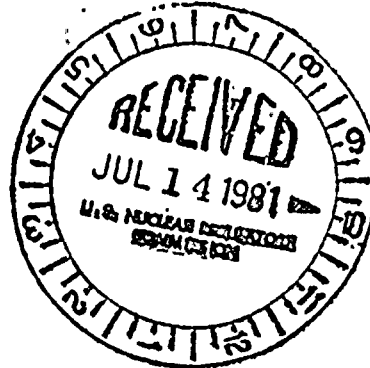

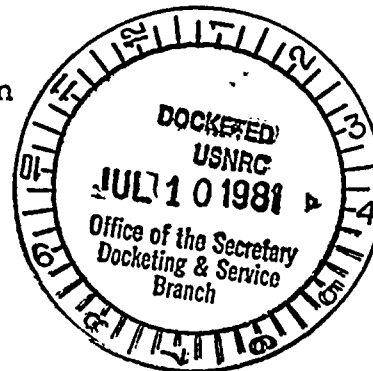

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

and the Board the opportunity to consider it in advance of the Prehearing Conference.

Applicants propose that hearings commence Monday morning, October 5, 1981. Hearings would run from Monday through Friday. To accommodate transportation schedules, hearings would start at 1:00 PM Mondays and conclude at 3:00 PM Fridays.

Under prior rulings of the Licensing Board, the parties must identify their expert witnesses and the substance of their testimony at least 60 days before the start of the hearing. Discovery Memo II, LBP-79-31, 10 NRC 597, 606-7 (1979). If the evidentiary hearing is to start on October 5, this submittal would be due on August 6, 1981. Because of the relatively short time from the Prehearing Conference to the August 6 deadline, we would hope that the Licensing Board would be able to announce the hearing schedule by the close of the Conference.
