Dear Mr. Eisenhut:

This letter requests an extension of time for submittals in response to Reference 1 for the Susquehanna Steam Electric Station Units 1 and 2. Pennsylvania Power & Light Co. intends to provide a timely response to as many of the requirements of Generic Letter 83-28 as possible. However, time consuming group interactions preclude response in full by the required date. We therefore request an extension of time for responses to positions 2.1, 2.2 and 4.5.

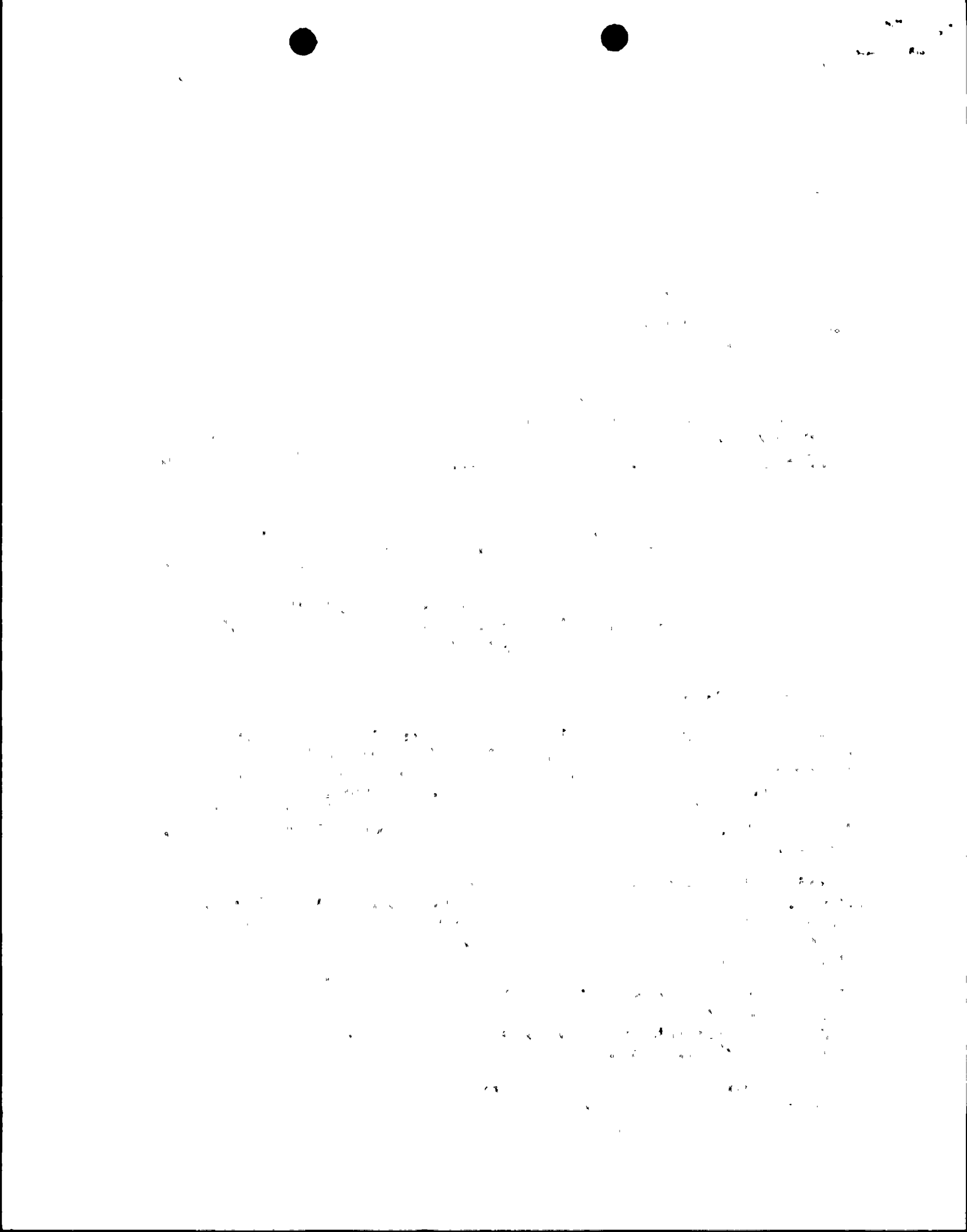
Generic Letter 83-28 encourages pursuit of some of the actions through Owners Groups. PP&L is a member of the BWR Owners Group (BWROG) and is participating in the BWROG's effort to respond to appropriate portions of the generic letter. We endorse the BWROG response to NRC generic letter 83-28 (Reference 2).

PP&L is also actively participating in an INPO Nuclear Utility Task Action Committee (NUTAC). This NUTAC has been formed to address position 2.2.2 regarding implementation of a program to ensure adequate vendor interface for safety-related components.

Both the BWROG and INPO activities involve a number of participants and have associated time consuming organizational and administrative procedures. To date, neither group has had an adequate opportunity to finalize the scope and

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
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schedule for programs to respond to the generic letter. Consequently, we hereby request an extension of time for submittals to positions 2.1, 2.2 and 4.5 to generic letter 83-28 to February 29, 1984. For the remaining positions, PP&L intends to furnish the status of current conformance and plans and schedules for any needed improvements within the 120 day deadline.

As you know, Susquehanna Unit 2 is nearing completion. Issuance of the operating license is expected in time to support a January, 1984 fuel load date. Since Unit 2 is essentially complete, our response to Generic Letter 83-28 will be for both units. Based on the information in your generic letter, we anticipate no licensing delays for Unit 2 resulting from this issue.
