Via the attached letter, PP&L provided the NRC staff with justifications for the deletion of Condition 2.C.(4)(b) of Operating License NPF-14.

Based on that justifications, we hereby request that License Condition 2.C.(4)(b) be deleted as reflected in the attached marked-up version of the affected page from the License.

NO SIGNIFICANT HAZARDS CONSIDERATIONS

This change is an example of an amendment not likely to involve Significant Hazards Considerations per 48FR14870, paragraph (iv):

"(iv) A relief granted upon demonstration of acceptable operation from an operating restriction that was imposed because acceptable operation was not yet demonstrated. This assumes that the operating restriction and the criteria to be applied to a request for relief have been established in a prior review and that it is justified in a satisfactory way that the criteria have been met."

The operating restriction in question is the subject license condition, which requires a new stability analysis prior to startup following the first refueling outage. The criteria to be applied to a request for relief were established in the review of the identical operating restriction on Susquehanna SES Unit 2. That license (NPF-22) was issued without the subject condition. This was due to PP&L's commitment to propose Technical Specifications which resolved NRC concerns relevant to the thermal hydraulic stability issue outlined in General Electric SIL No. 380. The NRC staff subsequently approved our proposal via Amendment No. 2 to License NPF-22, dated October 9, 1984. Since these same Technical Specifications have been issued for Susquehanna SES Unit 1 (Reference: Amendment No. 24 to License NPF-14, dated October 9, 1984) the appropriate criteria have been met. Therefore, License Condition 2.C.(4)(b) can be deleted.
