SUBJECT: Informs that enhanced dose projection model complete & operational, per SSER 3 commitment & NUREG-0654. Technique for inputting real time vent release data being evaluated. Action complete.

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1. The first part of the report deals with the general situation in the country. Item III.A.2 of Section 22 of Supplement 3 to the Susquehanna SES SER referenced PP&L's commitment to upgrade the "meteorological measurement systems, assessment capabilities, and remote integration capabilities, consistent with Appendix II to NUREG-0654..." In a letter to Mr. W. R. Butler dated May 30, 1985, (PLA-2467) PP&L stated the activities related to the commitment. As noted in the letter, an enhanced dose projection model was being implemented to upgrade our dose assessment capability. This model is now complete and operational.

PLA-2467 also listed a number of "features" associated with the dose projection model. One of the features identified the preferred method by which meteorological and vent release data is to be entered into the model. This method, which inputs real time data (automatic entry) has not yet been incorporated into the model for vent release data. This data is being inputted manually. PP&L is presently reevaluating the technique to be used to input real time vent release data. Either method of data entry is acceptable and results in a fully operational model.

This completes PP&L's action related to our commitment.
