The analysis provided in your June 28, 1988 letter does not appear to indicate that there is an unreviewed safety issue involved. If upon reexamination you find that the change in commitment does constitute an unreviewed safety issue, please write to us again and provide us your analysis which leads to such a determination. The staff will then perform an evaluation of the concerns raised and issue a safety evaluation.
