Dear Mr. Lehman:

On December 15, 1989, I spoke with Richard Mieszkowski and reported that Susquehanna Steam Electric Station (SSES) had hazardous waste accumulated on-site for more than 90 days. On December 19, 1989, Mr. Mieszkowski inspected the SSES Waste Accumulation Area and recommended I provide you with the details of this situation.

The hazardous waste involved is "RQ, Waste Flammable Solid, n.o.s. (D001)." This waste is generated as a result of using rags and various solvents for degreasing activities.

A waste shipment had been scheduled with Rollins Environmental Services, Inc. for November 22, 1989; however, this was cancelled on November 20, 1989 due to an unscheduled shutdown of their incinerator. PP&L was informed that a shipment could not be scheduled until the end of December or the beginning of January.

Disposal arrangements were immediately pursued under a second contract with Environmental Services Company, Inc. (ENSCO), but PP&L was informed that a shipment could not be scheduled until January.

To date, neither TSD facility has accepted this waste; however, PP&L recently finalized a third contract with Chemical Waste Management, Inc. and scheduled a shipment for January 4, 1990.

In the past, contracts with two TSD facilities have been sufficient to prevent storage of waste rags for more than 90 days. In the future, the existence of a third contract should further ensure that this situation does not recur.
