Dear Nuclear Regulatory Commission,

I am writing in regard to the revision of the Emergency Planning Zones to reduce and/or eliminate the Emergency Planning Zones around the New Scale Reactor that is proposed to be build in Idaho on the INL property.

The NuScale reactor is still a nuclear reactor, and it is a reactor that has never been built before. There is no reason to believe that the NuScale is any safer than another reactor. It has no proven "track record" and therefore we must take the same safety precautions as before. In fact, since it is unproven technology there's all the more reason to insist on the safety zones.

There must to be rules in place to protect public health in the case of a nuclear reactor accident. Eliminating the necessary safety zones can only be interpreted as a short cut to attempt to move the licensing process forward more quickly which is a dangerous and potentially disastrous precedent to set especially when it comes to nuclear power.

Please consider this carefully and don't give in to big money pressure. It's a precedent that in the future could mean people's lives.
