Dear Mr. Martin:

Reference (b) transmitted the findings from the NRC's review of Revision 5 and 6 to the Quad Cities Station Updated Final Safety Analysis Report (UFSAR). As a result of that evaluation and in response to the concerns identified, Commonwealth Edison committed to a program described in Reference (a) which would rebaseline the UFSAR for Dresden, Quad Cities and Zion Stations.

The intent of this letter is to document the completion of the Dresden Station UFSAR rebaseline project. The rebaselined UFSAR was developed from the existing UFSAR and the original FSAR including CECo's responses to the questions asked by the Atomic Energy Commission during the license application review. Other documents used during the development of the rebaselined UFSAR include the Technical Specifications, docketed correspondence between CECo and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), modifications and minor plant changes, General Electric design and purchasing specifications, and documentation of many CECo programs including the Systematic Evaluation Program (SEP) and the Mark I Containment Program.

This UFSAR replaces the previous UFSAR as part of the current licensing basis. Furthermore, due to the extent of reorganization and rewrite, this document is treated as an original issue and does not show revision bars in the margin.
