Dear Representative Collins:

I am contacting you on behalf of our membership to alert you to what we see as a matter of great concern to all residents of northern Illinois.

Local 73 has been involved in representing nuclear security officers (NSOs) for many years. I, for example, spent over a decade working at the Dresden Nuclear, Station.

Based on our experience, we are appalled at Commonwealth Edison's (CECO) plan to disarm most security officers at their nuclear plants around northern Illinois. This action is made worse by the fact that CECO has already reduced the security force by over 30 percent during the past eighteen months.

At the time CECO pushed hard to construct more nuclear reactors in northern Illinois than anywhere else in the country, they made a commitment to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), and more importantly to us, that they would maintain the highest level of safety and security possible to protect us.

Now that all their reactors are finished, CECO is telling us they want to save money by taking highly trained security officers and making them unarmed guards so they can pay them less money. This, at a time when terrorist threats have hit closer to home than at any time in our recent history.

They are arguing, through The Nuclear Energy Institute, that this is a coordinated plan that is nationwide and suggesting that the residents of northern Illinois should not have a say in the issue.
