In the Reference (a) letter, the NRC staff notified licensees about problems associated with the testing of safety-related logic circuits. In Reference (b), ComEd responded to Generic Letter (GL) 96-01 for all six of ComEd's stations and committed Dresden Station to implement the actions recommended by Generic Letter 96-01, during the fifteenth refueling outage for Dresden Unit 3 (D3R15). ComEd committed to implement the actions for Dresden Unit 2 during D2R15 (Fall, 1997).

Based upon the recent rescheduling of the next Dresden Unit 3 refueling outage from the Fall of 1996 until March, 1997, the purpose of this letter is to revise Dresden's commitment regarding implementation of the actions recommended by Generic Letter 96-01. Generic Letter 96-01 requested completion of actions prior to startup from the first refueling outage commencing one year after the issuance of the Generic Letter. Generic Letter 96-01 was issued on January 10, 1996. Because the commencement of D3R14 has been rescheduled past January 10, 1997, ComEd requests that the original commitment to implement the actions requested in Generic Letter 96-01 be accelerated to be performed during D3R14. D3R14 is presently scheduled to commence in March, 1997. It should be noted that the commitment to implement those actions recommended by GL 96-01 for Dresden Unit 2 remain unaffected (D2R15 - presently scheduled for Fall, 1997).
