The above referenced document provided Commonwealth Edison's response to the NRC staff's request for information pursuant to 10 CFR 50.54(f).

As part of Commonwealth Edison's Company's transition to a Nuclear Generating Group, and in light of associated organizational changes, a review has been conducted of the commitments in ComEd's March 28, 1997 response to the NRC's January 27, 1997 request for information under 10 CFR 50.54(f) to determine if any of those commitments would be changed materially.

The review that was performed showed that there was no material change to any commitments. The organization changes did affect, for example, the specific names of positions or work groups, and in other cases reporting relationships. The commitments have either been modified by the names of organizations or positions or by the relocation of functions to different organizational positions.

Overall, however, we have concluded that none of the administrative or organizational changes materially modify any of ComEd's commitments. All functions necessary for implementing those commitments will continue to be performed. If, in the future, there are additional organizational or other changes that could result in material modifications to these commitments, ComEd will inform the Commission of them in a timely manner.
