In this connection, Commonwealth Edison Company invites the Board to conduct such pre-hearing conference at the Exposition Building at the Dresden Nuclear Power Station. The Exposition Building is a facility which has been opened to the public during the five years of operation of Dresden Unit 1. More than 55,000 persons have visited this building to study the exhibits on display there and have received indoctrination talks and movies preliminary to a guided tour of the Dresden Station.

The building is situated adjacent to a visitors' parking lot with an entrance outside the security fence surrounding Dresden Unit 1. It has a room which can accommodate approximately 100 persons with facilities readily adaptable for the conduct of the requested pre-hearing conference. Convening the pre-hearing conference at the Exposition Building would provide an excellent opportunity for the Board and all interested parties to

examine the site and environs of the Dresden Nuclear
Power Station and observe the operation of Dresden Unit 1.
