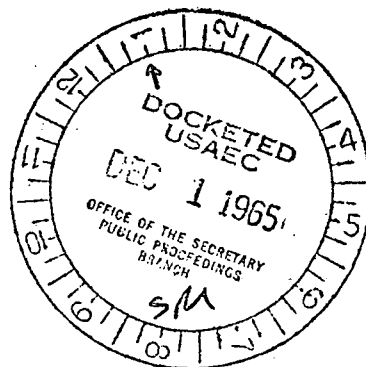

MOTION FOR RECEIPT OF THE  
TESTIMONY OF CHARLES A. LOVEJOY


The analysis by the regulatory staff of the financial qualifications of Commonwealth Edison Company is contained in the "Testimony of Charles A. Lovejoy, Office of the Controller, AEC." The testimony concludes that Commonwealth is financially qualified to construct the proposed facility, to assume responsibility for payment of Commission charges for the quantities of special nuclear materials requested and to undertake and carry out the proposed use of such materials for a reasonable period of time.

At the prehearing conference held on November 9, 1965, the staff stated that it might request a stipulation of the parties and approval of the Board to incorporate Mr. Lovejoy's testimony into the decisional record of the proceeding without requiring Mr. Lovejoy to appear. Copies of the testimony were distributed at that time. The suggestion was predicated on the condition that neither the parties nor the Board would have questions for the witness at the hearing.



The attached "Stipulation for the Receipt of the Testimony of Charles A. Lovejoy" stipulates that the parties to the proceeding will have no questions for the witness at the hearing and that accordingly, the testimony may be incorporated into the decisional record without formal authentication and presentation by the witness.

Accordingly, the staff moves that, in the event the Board has no questions for this witness, it authorize incorporation of the testimony of Mr. Lovejoy into the decisional record of this proceeding without requiring the formal authentication and presentation of the testimony by the witness at the hearing.

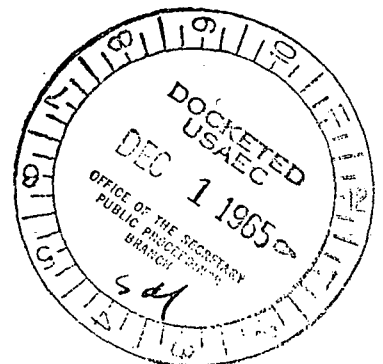




