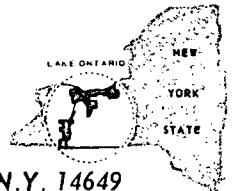




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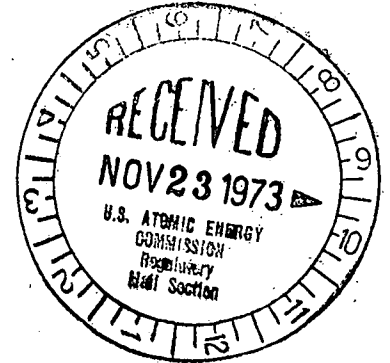

In response to your letter of October 1, 1973 regarding periodic inspections of hydraulic suppressors (snubbers), monthly inspections were conducted and reports submitted by my letters dated October 11, 1973 and October 26, 1973.

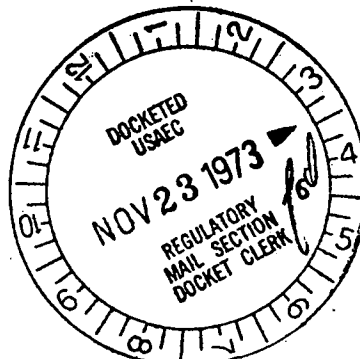
During the period October 21-25, 1973, the plant was in hot shutdown status and an inspection was again made of all fifty-five (55) safeguard and non-safeguard systems snubbers. All units were determined to be in operable and satisfactory condition.

As a result of this additional inspection in October, the next routine snubber inspection will be conducted no later than November 25, 1973.
