Dear Mrs. Fleishmann:

We appreciate your concern for the steam generator repair efforts at the Turkey Point Plant Unit Nos. 3 and 4, and the staff Safety Evaluation Report and Final Environmental Statement (copies enclosed) are the results of considerable staff efforts on this subject. They conclude that the health and safety of the public and the environment have been adequately protected. On the basis of these documents and supplemental testimony, the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board concluded that there was no need for a hearing (Copy of Order enclosed).

You may be interested to know that Florida Power and Light Company recently received a special permit and has already shipped about one thousand drums of waste to the licensed disposal site in the State of Washington.

I hope that this has been responsive to your concerns.
