Dear Mr. Denton:

Attached is a proposed revision to the "Commonwealth Edison Company Requalification Program for Licensed Operators, Senior Operators, and Senior Operators (Limited)."

This revision to the Topical Report addresses concerns recently expressed by Mr. Joe Buzy of the License Qualification Branch. Section IV.A.4 of this revised topical report seeks to extend the waiver of suspension from licensed duties due to requalification examination deficiencies from 30 to 60 days. The following is provided as justification.

The period required for completion of accelerated training and re-examination of personnel who have been granted a waiver of suspension of licensed duties should be extended from 30 days to 60 days. The extended time frame allows for better coordination of the scheduling requirements. The accelerated training and re-examination requires coordination of the following schedules:

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
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- Training Department instructor and classroom availability.
- Operating Department provide shift coverage for personnel involved.
- Individual personnel involved must be available for previously scheduled training requirements.

An additional concern is the fact that some stations schedule the entire requalification program to cover the last six months of the year. Therefore, due to the grading process, all failures appear within a three month period. These concerns are the basis for requesting the extending time frame.
