Dear Mr. Murley:

The above referenced letters were in regards to a request made by Commonwealth Edison to amend fire protection license conditions for Dresden and Quad Cities Stations. These changes reflected a number of modifications which had not been completed in accordance with existing requirements. The letters identify the specific modifications and document interim actions which were under effect, while these issues were being resolved. Interim actions were required only at Dresden. All Dresden interim actions (listed in Reference (a)) have been suspended as the long term modifications (with the exception of Item 2.2 listed in Attachment 2 to reference letter (b)) have been completed. These modifications are presently being tested. All work associated with this modification will be completed by the Dresden Appendix R Inspection, currently scheduled for September 28, 1987.

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
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After these documents were submitted to your staff for there review, Generic Letter 86-10 was issued. Generic Letter 86-10 proposes the removal of fire protection technical specifications and the insertion of a description of the fire protection program in the FSAR as well as change in the fire protection license conditions. We believe that continuing the review requested in our March 4, 1986 letter may result in a duplication of effort. As a result, we request that the NRC suspend the review of the license amendments proposed in our March 4, 1986 letter at this time pending further communication from Commonwealth Edison.

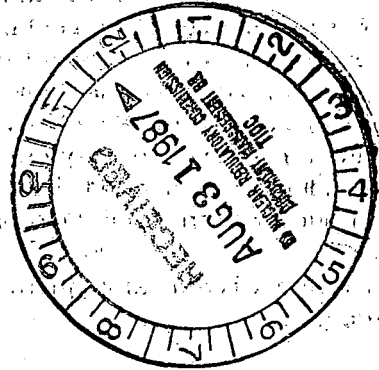
