LICENSEE:

The inspection was an examination of the activities conducted under your license as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) rules and regulations and the conditions of your license. The inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspector. The inspection findings are as follows:

PROGRAM SCOPE

JANX Integrity Group (JANX) is a large non-destructive testing company authorized for industrial radiography at temporary job sites, 3 specifically authorized temporary job sites, and has 29 locations in NRC jurisdiction authorized for storage and dispatch. The above address is a residence in Casper, Wyoming.

The employee whose residence the vehicle was at is part of a two-man team that meets at the residence to dispatch to job sites in the region. The employee had all the applicable equipment and records available for review by the inspector. The employee had two calibrated NDS 2000 survey meters (S/N 77694 and 73635), both calibrated (due for calibration on July 30, 2017). The employee also had appropriate 10 CFR 34.47 monitoring available and calibrated appropriately- badge, personal dosimeter, and alarming rate meter. The individual was competent and demonstrated the use of the above instruments. The camera had current source and camera leak tests available on the vehicle.

The truck had shipping papers appropriate to the materials on board and within reach of a driver. The truck also had a binder (or in electronic form on a laptop) with JANX's current NRC license, Operating and Emergency Procedures, and contact information in case of emergency.

The exposure device was labeled appropriately, and the inspector confirmed the transport index that appeared on the label and the shipping papers with his own instruments (RadEye G, S/N 370, cal due November 4, 2017, and a Ludlum 2401-EC2, S/N 21116G, cal due March 13, 2018).

The last main office inspection was on January 23, 2017, and a temporary job site inspection was conducted on May 26, 2017, with no violations identified in either. However, Inspection Report 03011772/2016002 was issued on June 1, 2017, and cited three violations as part of a Severity Level III problem. These violations included citations for: 10 CFR 34.41(a), 34.49(b), and 34.31(b). The 2017-003 Casper inspection was not of a temporary job site, and as such the the inspector believes the inspection, although it did not identify any issues with these requirements, would not be sufficient to close these violations. A clear 591 was issued from the RIII office to the Corporate RSO.
