Dear Mr Hanauer

On February 14, 1981 Mr A A Young and myself met with you and your staff to discuss our plans to provide a future training program for the Palisades Nuclear Station personnel.

During our presentation you expressed a concern that we don't have a mechanism in which our plant personnel are informed about problems in the industry. Your example was the St Lucie incident IE Circular 80-15.

At that meeting I explained that we do have such a mechanism and it is explained in our Palisade Plant NUREG-0737 response dated December 19, 1980. In regard to your specific example, one of our Shift Technical Advisors was requested to review our Emergency Operating Procedures as stated in Item 2 of the subject IE circular. It should also be noted that the St Lucie incident was reviewed with our operators and shift supervisors, with documentation available at the plant site.

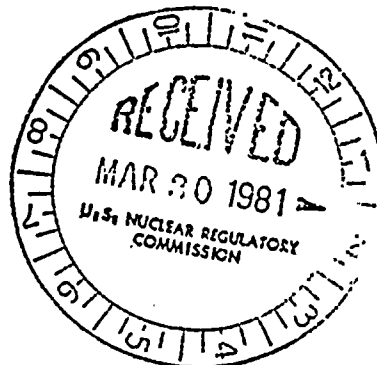
We believe that the review mechanism that was demonstrated above is acceptable and no further changes are needed for this process.
