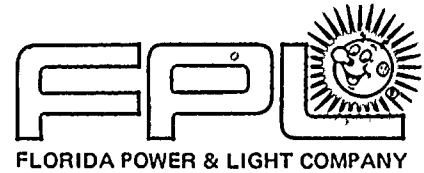
Dear Dr. Wayne:

I have received your letter of January 14, 1964, regarding the work of the Chicago group on the structure of the active site of the enzyme. I am sorry that I cannot provide you with a more definitive answer at this time, but the data available to us is still preliminary and requires further investigation.

The results of our experiments to date indicate that the active site is located in the region of the protein molecule which is highly conserved among the various species of the enzyme. This region is also characterized by a high degree of flexibility, which may be important for the catalytic activity of the enzyme.

I am sure that your continued interest in this problem will be appreciated, and I will be glad to discuss the results of our work in more detail at a later date.

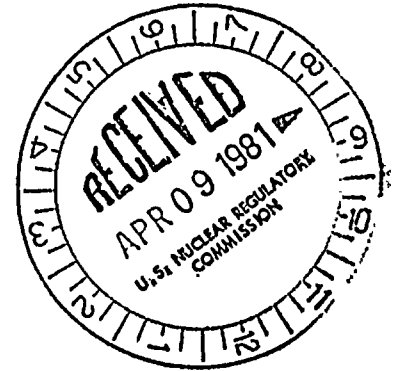
