Per your request, a Pre-Decisional Enforcement Conference (PEC) will be held to discuss the apparent violation documented in our letter of July 6, 2017. The conference will be held on Tuesday, September 19, 2017, from 10:00 am to 12:00 am, in the NRC Region II Office located at Marquis One Tower, 245 Peachtree Center Avenue, NE, Atlanta, GA 30303-1257. Upon arrival, please proceed to the visitor access point on the 8th floor of the Marquis One Tower, and you will be escorted to the meeting.

The conference will afford you the opportunity to provide your perspective on these matters and any other information that you believe the NRC should take into consideration before making an enforcement decision. The decision to hold a PEC does not mean that the NRC has determined that a violation has occurred or that enforcement action will be taken. The purpose of the conference is to discuss the apparent violation and the circumstances surrounding it, and to give you an opportunity to provide your perspective on this issue and any other information that you believe is relevant to the NRC's enforcement determination. You are specifically invited to address the factors that the NRC would consider in determining whether enforcement action should be taken against you. In addition, you may have an attorney or personal representative attend the conference, but it should be understood that the NRC will address its questions to you. These factors are described in the NRC Enforcement Policy in the section titled "Enforcement Actions Involving Individuals. Additionally, this conference will be closed to the public because it is associated with an OI report, the results of which have not been made publicly available.

Following the PEC, you will be advised by separate correspondence of the results of our deliberations on this matter. No response regarding the apparent violation is required at this time.

Because this letter references and encloses information addressing NRC's review of an apparent violation that may result in enforcement action against an individual, this letter and its enclosures will be maintained by the Office of Enforcement in an NRC Privacy Act system of records, NRC-3, "Enforcement Actions Against Individuals." This system, which is not publicly-accessible, includes all records pertaining to individuals who are being or have been considered for enforcement action, whether such action was taken or not. The NRC-3 system notice, which

provides detailed information about this system of records, can be accessed from our website at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/foia/privacy-systems.html>.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," should the NRC conclude that enforcement action against you is warranted, a copy of this letter, and any response (if you choose to provide one), will be made available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room and from the NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>. To the extent possible, your response should not include any personal privacy, proprietary, or safeguards information so that it can be made available to the Public without redaction.
