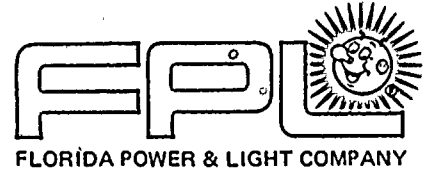

Florida Power & Light Company letter L-83-601, dated December 22, 1983, requested an amendment to Appendix A of Facility Operating License NPF-16, concerning Axial Shape Index.

As stated in the Safety Evaluation and Statement of No Significant Hazards attached to the December 22, 1983 letter, the proposed change is an administrative change and does not involve any safety concerns. Therefore, in accordance with 10 CFR 170.22 a check in the amount of \$1,200.00 is attached for a Class II license amendment fee.

Regarding the No Significant Hazards Consideration determination, the proposed amendment is similar to example (i) of amendments that are considered not likely to involve significant hazards considerations presented in the Staff's procedure for determination of no significant hazards consideration. That is, the proposed change is purely administrative in nature to achieve consistency in form between the St. Lucie Unit 1 and St. Lucie Unit 2 technical specifications for Axial Shape Index, and in so doing, the proposed change corrects the oversight made when these figures were drawn for inclusion in the St. Lucie Unit 2 Technical Specifications.

This letter supplements the December 22, 1983 request for license amendment.
