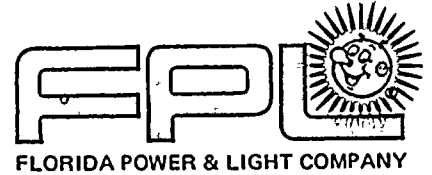

Dear Mr. English:

On December 29, 1983 and on January 10, 1984 personnel from Applied Biology, Inc. had occasion to handle two injured juvenile brown pelicans at our St. Lucie Plant (St. Lucie County).

The pelican recovered on December 29 had a severely broken right wing and was examined by Dr. Stanley N. Wampler of the Jensen Beach Animal Hospital. Due to the severity of the injury, and after conferring with Jean Henry of the Martin County Bird Rescue Center, Dr. Wampler euthanatized the bird.

The pelican recovered on January 10, 1984 had a broken right wing and a 30 cm long laceration on the neck. The pelican was examined by Dr. Wampler and then Jean Henry took possession of the bird the next day for recovery.

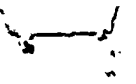

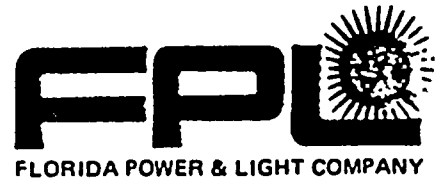
