SUBJECT: INSPECTION INTERVAL OF LOW-PRESSURE TURBINE DISCS; ST. LUCIE PLANT, UNIT NO. 2

The staff has reviewed your submittals of April 9 and August 6, 1984 concerning the inspection interval of the low-pressure turbine discs for St. Lucie Plant, Unit No. 2. Our conclusions are included in the enclosed Safety Evaluation.

Your commitment to perform turbine disc inspections in accordance with the turbine vendor's recommendations has been reviewed in light of the staff's earlier approval of the methodology used by the turbine vendor.

As a result of this review, turbine disc inspection intervals of 3.49 years and 3.12 years for LP#1 and LP#2, respectively, have been judged to be acceptable.

This completes the staff effort on your request and no further action on your part is required.
