Relief from Parts of ASME Code Section XI


By letters L-83-510, dated October 6, 1983; L-84-287, dated October 25, 1984; L-84-340, dated November 19, 1984; and L-85-259, dated July 5, 1985, Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) requested relief from certain ASME Code Class 1, 2, and 3 component examination requirements determined to be impractical to perform. Based upon the information provided in the above correspondence, the staff determined that the Code Class 1, 2, and 3 component supports have not been specifically selected and scheduled for examination in accordance with Section XI, subsection IWF. By letter dated October 10, 1986 (A. C. Thadani to C. O. Woody), the staff requested FPL specify the sample of supports to be examined and the schedule for examinations. The staff also requested that FPL update and resubmit its Inservice Inspection Program, accordingly.

FPL will be submitting a summary program for the first ten year Inservice Inspection Interval by March 8, 1987. This summary program will specify the Code Class 1, 2, and 3 component supports to be examined and the schedule for examinations.

The March 8, 1987 submittal date has been discussed with your staff and found to be acceptable.
