"If your child's school is in session at the time evacuation is recommended, children attending schools located within the emergency planning zone (EPZ) will be transported to designated host schools outside the area." "Contact school officials for more information."

And, if we do not have host schools designated already in the Oswego area, why would such an idea be included in a supposedly well-reviewed piece of information for the public?
