This is to confirm that we will perform a prospective evaluation demonstrating that unmonitored individuals are not likely to receive, in one year, a radiation dose in excess of 10% of the allowable limits in 10 CFR Part 20 that meets the requirements listed under “Criteria” in NUREG 1556, Vol. 1, dated November 2001.
3. With regards to the radioactive waste management, once the nuclear gauge is no longer needed, it will be sent to a waste disposal facility or returned to the manufacturer for proper disposal.


