St. Lucie Plant Safety Policy

Attached is a copy of a recent change to the St. Lucie Plant (PSL) policy regarding the use of protective footwear. This policy will become effective July 1, 1995 and requires that safety shoes with an ANSI Z-41 toe compression rating be worn by all personnel when working at the site. Exemptions may be granted on a case-by-case basis by the Site Vice President, Plant General Manager, or Services Manager.

Also included for your review is a copy of existing plant policies governing safety hat and eye protection usage while on site.

Florida Power and Light Company (FPL) requests that NRC employees and visitors engaged in activities at St. Lucie Plant comply with the enclosed personal protective equipment guidelines.

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



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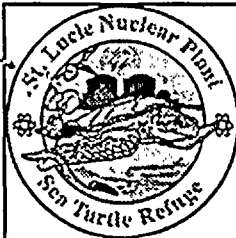

It is each employee's responsibility to adhere to proper safe work practices, including proper foot protection while in the working or applicable training environment. Proper foot protection will minimize the hazard associated with falling objects, objects rolling onto the foot, objects piercing the sole and electrical hazards.

1. All personnel shall wear ANSI Z-41 1991 Compression Footwear while working at St. Lucie Plant.
2. When entering the site for the purpose of coming to work:
  - a. Personnel entering the East Security Building should proceed no further than D-13 without wearing safety shoes.
  - b. Personnel entering the North Security Building should proceed no further than the North Services Building without wearing safety shoes.
3. Personnel subject to electrical hazards shall wear ANSI Z-41 1991 Compression Footwear with Electrical Hazard Protection (EH) designation. This includes, but is not limited to, employees in Electrical Maintenance, I&C Maintenance, Operations, and certified welders.
4. Exceptions to the requirement of Item 1 above for certain personnel (e.g., visitors to the plant) may be granted on a case-by-case basis by the Site Vice President, Plant General Manager, or Services Manager.

Supervisors and foremen shall be accountable for ensuring that employees utilize proper foot protection. Footwear shall be clearly identifiable as ANSI approved (EH/compression toe rating designated where applicable).

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SAFETY HAT POLICY

PROCEDURE PRODUCTION

Reference: D.A. Sager letter #529 dated December 3, 1986

It is everyone's responsibility to observe proper attention to the potential for injury to the head from falling objects. Therefore, it is necessary for all of us to adhere to proper safety practices during the conduct of our jobs.

1. Employees shall wear safety hats to ensure proper protection to the head when:
  - a. working in a construction area.
  - b. on or around power plants, overhead or underground lines, substations or related equipment.
  - c. working in areas where there is a potential for injury to the head from falling objects.
  - d. inside the Radiation Controlled Area (RCA) or Reactor Containment Building (RCB).
2. When entering or exiting the site for the purpose of coming to or leaving from work, employees entering/exiting:
  - a. the East Security building may proceed no further than D-13 without wearing a safety hat.
  - b. the North Security building may proceed no further than the North Services building without wearing a safety hat.
3. Visitors to the above areas shall also wear safety hats.
4. Employees working in offices, control rooms, maintenance shops and warehouses are not required to wear safety hats in these areas.
5. Safety hats may be removed when:
  - a. employee is welding and the safety hat will not physically fit into the work area.
  - b. employee is seated as the crane operator in any enclosed cab crane on site.
  - c. employee is wearing a respirator or bubble hood.
  - d. directed by supervision in the work area where it has been determined that the wearing of a safety hat reduces the margin to safe performance of the job.

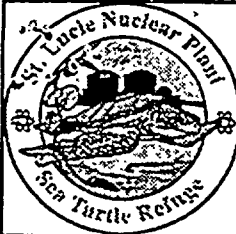
Supervisors and foremen shall be accountable for ensuring that employees utilize a safety hat to protect the head from injury and for initiating prompt corrective action when required.

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It is everyone's responsibility to observe proper attention to eye protection and eye safety. Therefore, it is necessary for all of us to adhere to proper safety practices during the conduct of our jobs.

1. Employees shall wear ANSI approved eye and/or face protection when:
  - a. machines or operations present potential eye and/or face injury from physical, chemical or radiation agents.
  - b. hazards exist from flying particles, molten metals, liquid chemicals, acids or caustic liquids, chemical gases or vapors and potential injurious light (welding flash).
  - c. operating hydraulic equipment for test or production purposes.
  - d. switching or working on any energized lines or equipment.
2. Employees shall wear ANSI approved eye protection at all times when they are in outdoor areas or covered work areas of the plant.
3. Spectacle-type safety glasses, goggles and face shields for general eye and/or face protection are available from Nuclear Materials Management.
4. Employees desiring prescription safety glasses may purchase them through the St. Lucie Plant Eye Protection Program.
5. Eye and face protection equipment shall be maintained clean and in good repair to maximize its protection benefit when worn.

Supervisors and foremen shall be accountable for ensuring that employees utilize proper eye and face protection equipment when required and for initiating prompt corrective action when required.
