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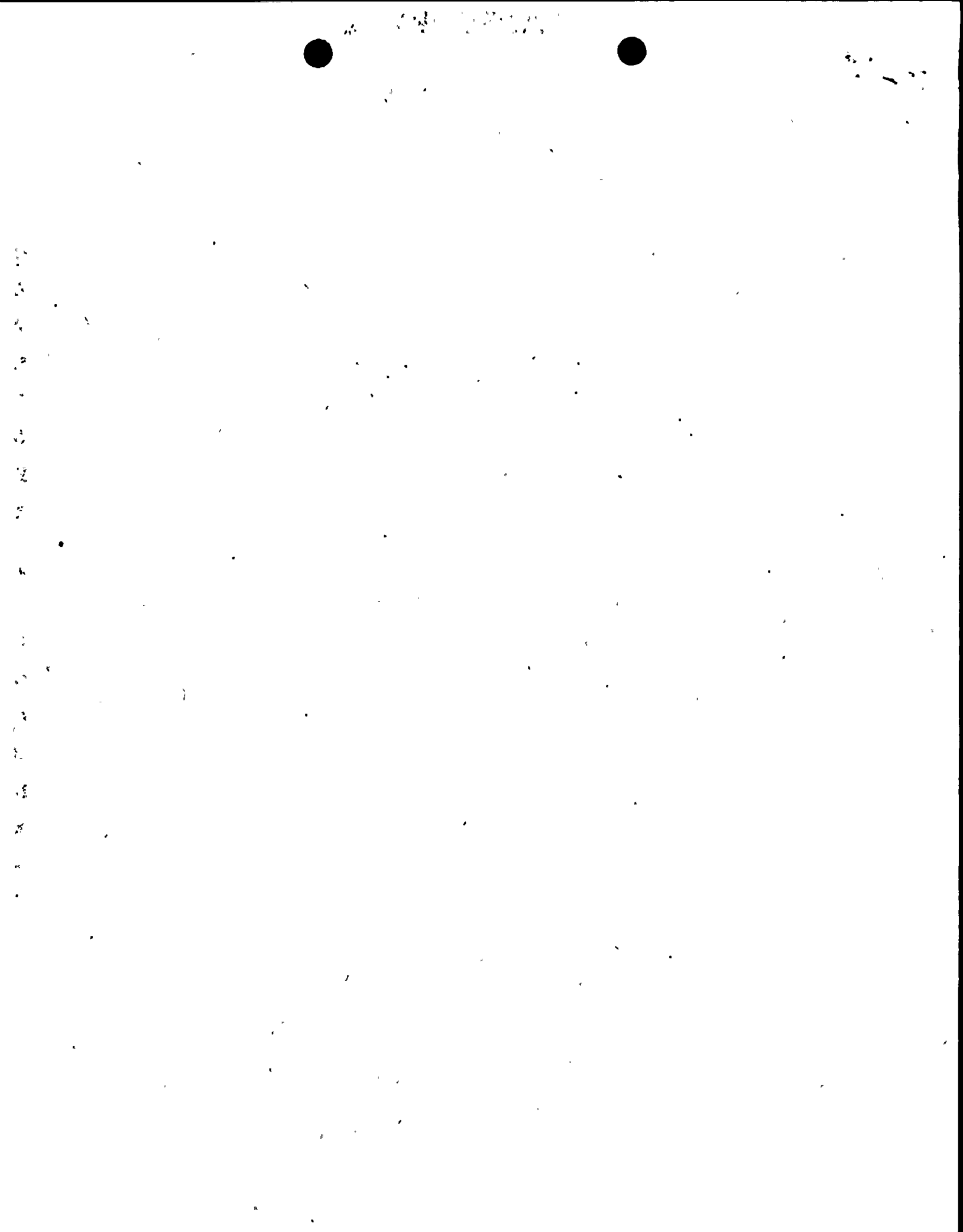

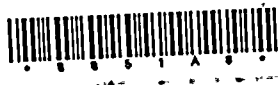

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS

ST LUCIE PLANT

Reportable Events

January 21, 1997

A confirmed positive random test result was received on a contractor supervisor for Marijuana. Telephone notification was made at 1537 hrs on January 21, 1997. A review was conducted of the subject's quality work activities prior to the test. The review concluded that the contractor supervisor had not been involved in any safety related work activities. The individual's unescorted access authorization was revoked.

April 7, 1997

Suspected drug paraphernalia was found in the protected area. The item was a beer can dented and modified for possible use with illegal drugs. The item was extracted from the retention area of a portable toilet while it was being serviced. The portable toilet was brought on site in preparation for an outage. Other areas of the plant were searched immediately with negative results.

Telephone notification was made at 1214 hrs on April 7, 1997. As a result of finding the item, the following actions were taken:

- Security Officers conducted random searches
- The random test rate was increased for the duration of the outage
- Local law enforcement conducted drug dog searches of buildings
