Ron:

By letter dated November 5, 2014, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission renewed Source Material License SUA-1534 issued to Crow Butte Resources, Inc., Crow Butte Uranium In-Situ Recovery Project, Dawes County, Nebraska (TAC J00555).

License Condition 9.6 states, "Release of surficially contaminated equipment, materials, or packages for unrestricted use shall be in accordance with the NRC guidance document "Guidelines for Decontamination of Facilities and Equipment Prior to Release for Unrestricted Use or Termination of Licenses for Byproduct, Source, or Special Nuclear Material," (the Guidelines) dated April 1993 (Adams Accession No. ML003745526), or in accordance with a suitable alternative program which shall be approved by NRC prior to any such release".

"The Guidelines of approved alternative program shall also apply to the removal of equipment,

materials, or packages from restricted areas that have the potential for accessible surface contamination levels above background regardless of the intent to release these items for unrestricted use. The licensee shall document their surveys of equipment, materials, or packages prior to removing them from a restricted area”.

By letter dated December 19, 2014, CBO proposed an alternative Controlled Release Survey Program (CRSP) for the Crow Butte Resources, Inc. operation. Crow Butte no longer wants to pursue this program and requests that it be removed from consideration.
