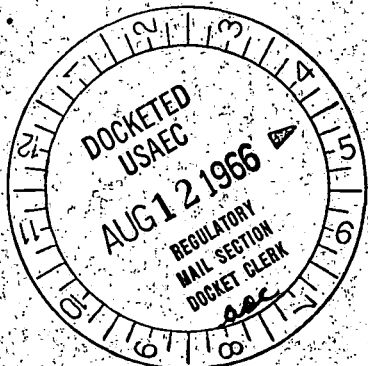

Dear Dr. Doan:

On July 28, 1966, F. A. Hollenbach of General Electric Company submitted to Mr. E. Case, Division of Reactor Licensing thirty copies of the draft of the description and evaluation of Dresden Unit 3 emergency core cooling provisions to permit review prior to the meeting of the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards on August 5, 1966. In response to certain questions raised at such meeting, Mr. Hollenbach submitted on August 12, 1966, further description and evaluation of the emergency core cooling systems for Dresden Unit 3, including certain changes in the system previously reviewed. The changes reflected in the August 12 submittal were the subject of discussion during the August 12, 1966 meeting of the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards.

Commonwealth Edison Company now requests that such July 28 submittal as modified by the August 12 submittal be accepted and considered as Amendment No. 5 to the Plant Design and Analysis Report for Dresden Unit 3 filed herein. Additional copies of such amendment No. 5 as required by 10 CFR Part 50 are being sent to the Commission under separate cover.
