Gentlemen:

By letter dated September 17, 1975, you proposed license amendments and technical specification changes related to possession and use limits for special nuclear, byproduct and source materials. You proposed to incorporate authorization for receipt, possession, storage or transfer, but not separation of such byproduct and special nuclear material as may be produced by operation of any Commonwealth Edison facility licensed pursuant to 10 CFR Part 50.

By letters dated December 8, 1975, you described and analyzed proposed modifications to the fuel storage pools for Dresden Units 2 and 3 and Quad Cities Units 1 and 2. The modifications would increase the storage capacity of the fuel storage pools and would allow storage of fuel from the Dresden 1 reactor in the fuel storage pools of Dresden Units 2 and 3. The December 8, 1975 letters did not request NRC approval of the proposed modifications.

We consider the information contained in the December 8, 1975 letters to be supplemental to and part of our review of your September 17, 1975 request for a license amendment and changes to the technical specifications. It is our position that the proposed modification to the fuel storage pools should not be made without prior NRC approval. Unless you notify us to the contrary within 20 days of the date of this letter, we will consider your December 8, 1975 letters as supplemental application for amendment to the Dresden 2 and 3 and Quad Cities 1 and 2 licenses.

To enable us to complete our review you are requested to either restrict your request to store the irradiated fuel from a specific reactor in another specific reactor's fuel storage pool or provide safety analyses for all types of new or irradiated fuel to be stored, similar in scope to the analyses presented in your December 8 letter for storage of Dresden 1 fuel at Dresden 2 or 3.
