Thank you for your correspondence concerning the Ginna Plant as related to the accident at Three Mile Island Nuclear Station, Unit 2.

I regret that this reponse has been delayed. The accident and its consequences have created a substantial increase in the agency's workload, which has prevented us from responding to you as promptly as we would have wished.

NRC appreciates your concerns about nuclear power and we hope that the enclosed document will provide you with additional information concerning the effects of the Three Mile Island accident on the safety considerations at other nuclear power plants. Each of the plants is being reviewed against the requirements of this document.

In regard to the issue of environmental qualification of electrical connectors, by Memorandum and Order of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission dated April 13, 1978 (item f in the conclusion), the UCS Petition you have referred to was denied because the qualification of electrical penetrations, terminal blocks and connectors has been demonstrated, or a qualification test program is underway.
