SUBJECT: REACTOR COOLANT PUMP TRIP AND RESTART CRITERIA

R. E. Ginna Nuclear Power Plant

The Safety Evaluation Report (NUREG-0916) related to the restart of Ginna after the tube rupture incident on January 25, 1982 and specifically license conditions 2.C(9)1 through 20 require that Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation address 20 long-term items.

The staff has completed its review of item 8 (Reactor Coolant Pump Trip Criteria) and item 9 (Reactor Coolant Pump Restart Criteria). The review was based on the information submitted with your letter of November 22, 1982 and your response dated (April 22, 1983) to Generic Letter 83-10d. Based on our review of your responses, we conclude that you have taken adequate steps to address the reactor coolant pump (RCP) trip and restart issues. You have acceptably fulfilled the commitments made in items 2.C(9)8 and 2.C(9)9.

The staff considers items 8 and 9 to be resolved. The reviews of items 1, 3, 4, 5, 7, and 17 have been completed and the safety evaluations forwarded to you. The remaining items of your response of November 22, 1982 are still under review. The staff will also review the Westinghouse Owners Group (NOG) submittal concerning RCP trip and its applicability to Ginna. The NOG submittal is currently scheduled for December, 1983. As the review for each item is completed, you will be informed of the results.


