This refers to the routine inspection conducted by Mr. K. Plumlee of this office on September 23-26, 1980 and November 24-26, 1980 at the R.E. Ginna Nuclear Power Plant, Ontario, New York of activities authorized by NRC License No. DPR-18 and to the discussions of our findings held by Mr. Plumlee with Mr. B. Snow and others of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

Areas examined during this inspection are described in the Office of Inspection and Enforcement Inspection Report which is enclosed with this letter. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, measurements made by the inspector, and observations by the inspector.

Our inspector also verified the steps you have taken to correct the items of noncompliance and deviation brought to your attention in letters dated February 6, 1979, February 7, 1980, and July 17, 1980. We have no further questions regarding your action at this time.

In addition, our inspector examined those activities conducted under your license relating to the subjects covered in your letters to the Director, NRC Region I, dated November 11, 1976, to the Director, NRC Office of Inspection and Enforcement dated May 23, 1978. We have no further questions regarding these matters. Within the scope of this inspection, no items of noncompliance were observed.

The information sought to be withheld shall be incorporated as far as possible into a separate part of the affidavit. If we do not hear from you in this regard within the specified period, the report will be placed in the Public Document Room.

No reply to this letter is required; however, should you have any questions concerning this inspection, we will be pleased to discuss them with you.
