Dear Ms. Strangis:

Enclosed is an application from AREVA Inc., dated August 9, 2017, requesting amendment No. 02 to its existing export license (XSNM03471/01-R). The license presently authorizes the export of low enriched and natural uranium in various forms and compositions to Zircotec Precision Industries in Canada for use as fuel and as sample, test, and/or demonstration material in finished fuel assemblies. These assemblies will ultimately be used as fuel in the Bruce A Generating Station. In addition, natural uranium as residual contamination on packing material used to ship the feed and blend material to AREVA will be returned to Cameco Corporation and/or Zircotec Precision Industries as well.

The purpose of this amendment is to change the licensee name and licensee point of contact.

There are no changes to the terms and conditions of the existing license being requested. Therefore, our office is processing this as a minor amendment, as part of AREVA Inc.'s transfer of control. Once it is determined that applicable legal requirements are satisfied, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission will issue the license.
