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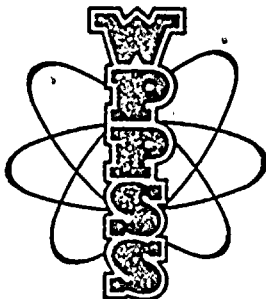

PREOPERATIONAL AQUATIC MONITORING PROGRAM

The Washington Public Power Supply System has a commitment in the Environmental Reports and Final Environmental Statements for the subject projects to conduct a preoperational monitoring program. The Environmental Reports for both WNP-2 and 1/4 Project commit to a two-year program. The Final Environmental Statement for WPPSS Nuclear Projects Nos. 1 and 4 discusses the inter-relation of the three reactor project schedules (1, 2, and 4). Because of the scheduled operational dates at that time, one could have anticipated that the monitoring effort would cover a continuous period from 1975 through 1984. As with most projects, our projects have experienced some delay in construction completion.

We have completed the preoperational program and have collected more than two years data for all elements of the program. We propose to substantially curtail the program, reactivating our monitoring effort with the Number 2 operational program. Our contract with our ecological consultant expires on March 31, 1980. It takes some time to negotiate contract renewals, so if you have any difficulty with our plan to substantially curtail the monitoring program, we would need to know that by January 15, 1980.

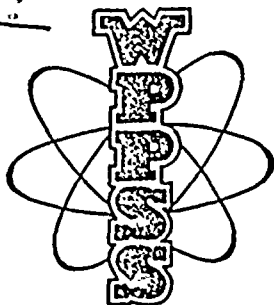
