Recently, the Lewis and Douglas County Public Utility District Commissioners have voted to withdraw from membership in the Washington Public Power Supply System. This action follows the earlier withdrawal of three other public utility districts from the Supply System. The Supply System membership now consists of 18 public agencies (14 public utility districts, and 4 municipal utilities). There is a possibility that other agencies may also withdraw from membership.

As we have earlier indicated (Reference 1), withdrawal from membership does not release these agencies from their financial obligation to existing Supply System projects. It does, however, eliminate their ability to sit as members of the Supply System Board of Directors and to vote on Supply System business matters. They will obviously not be obligated to any future liabilities of the Supply System, but will remain liable for those stemming from decisions made while they were members.

We will continue to advise you should the above described situation change.
