SUBJECT: POST MAINTENANCE TEST REQUIREMENTS - PALO VERDE RESPONSE TO  
GENERIC LETTER 83-28

Your response to Generic Letter 83-28 was provided by letter dated November 3, 1983. Items 3.1.3 and 3.2.3 in the generic letter requested that you identify any post-maintenance test requirements for reactor trip system components and other safety-related components, respectively, which can be demonstrated to degrade rather than enhance safety.

In your November 3, 1983 response to Items 3.1.3 and 3.2.3, you state that there are no post-maintenance testing requirements which degrade safety for either the reactor trip system components or other safety-related components. On this basis, we find your responses to Items 3.1.3 and 3.2.3 of Generic Letter 83-28 to be acceptable.

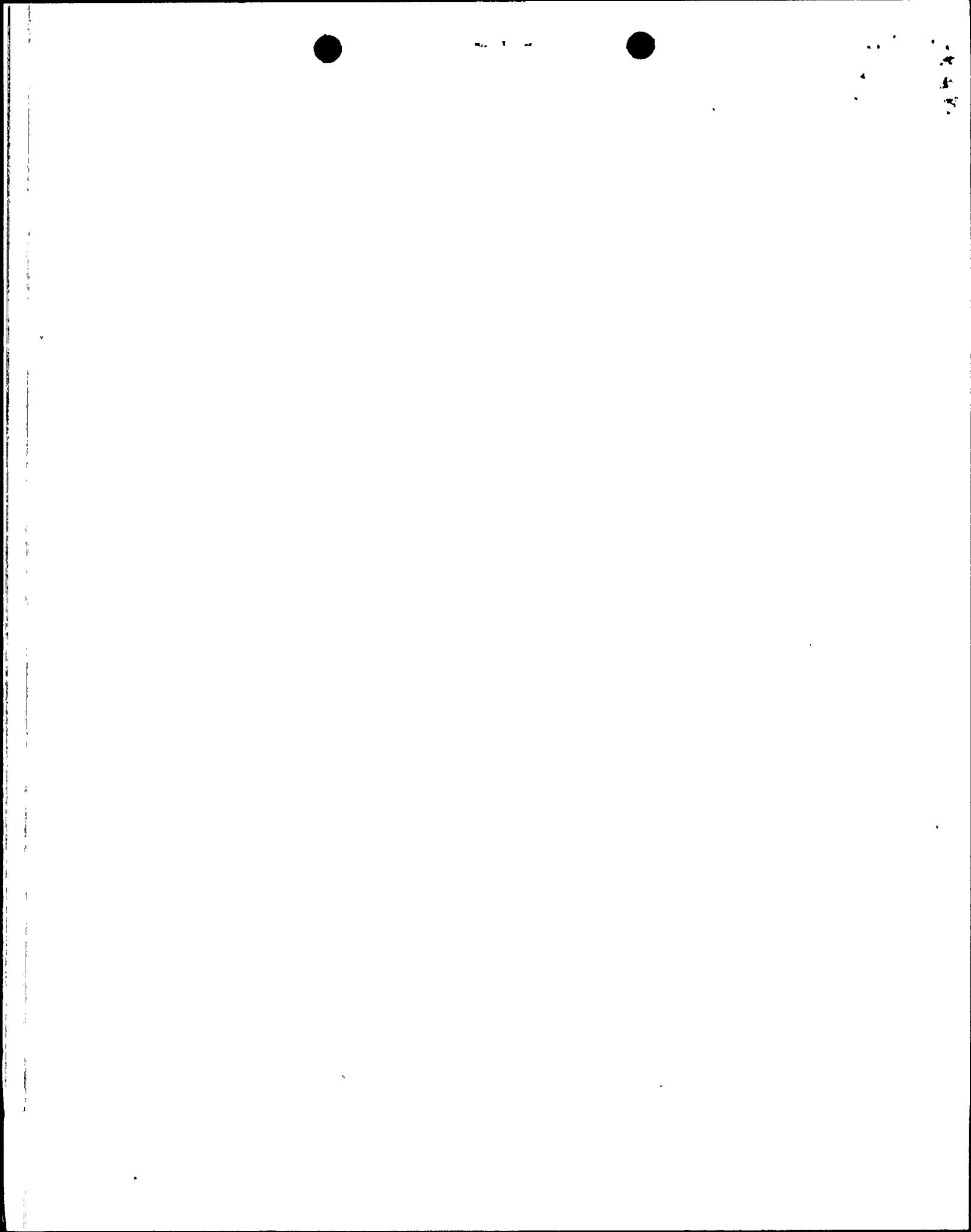
