Dear Dr. McClure:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 62 to your NRC Material License No. 21-12829-01 in accordance with your September 6, 2017 request (ML17254A389). Please review the enclosed license amendment document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9892 so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

We have noted that the letter submitted with your request identifies the licensee as "Metro Health – University of Michigan Health." However, to date, we have received neither an amendment request for a name change nor a request for NRC consent to Transfer of Control (TOC) in our office. Please note that any TOC must be consented to by the NRC, prior to the transfer. Additionally, the licensee is required to request an amendment for any name change. At this time, it is our understanding that there has been no TOC and the licensee is not requesting a name change, on the license.

Please note that, in accordance your letter, the enclosed amendment has authorized Gregg Schubach, M.D. for the use of yttrium-90 SIR-spheres microspheres, as permitted by Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* Section 35.1000. The authorization is conditioned on Dr. Schubach's completion of at least three in vivo SIR-sphere administrations, while under the supervision of a manufacturer representative or an Authorized User (AU). You will need to notify us promptly, in writing, after the cases have been completed, including the date(s) on which cases were complete including the name of the supervising individual. With this information, we can issue an administrative amendment to your NRC license to reflect the updated training, if necessary. You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

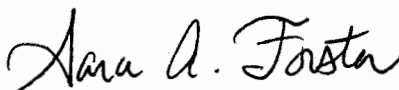
