Honeywell submits the following supplemental information clarifying the proposed license condition that we requested in a letter dated September 7, 2017:

LC-XX

Notwithstanding the requirements of 10 CFR Paragraph 40.60(b)(3), the licensee is exempt from the requirement to notify the NRC within 24 hours of unplanned medical treatment of an individual with spreadable contamination on the individual's clothing or body at the onsite medical facility. The licensee commits to maintain a log of contaminated workers treated at the onsite medical facility and provide the information for NRC inspection upon request.
