Enclosed is Amendment No. 11 renewing your NRC Material License No. 24-32591-01 in accordance with your request.

Please note that, we did not list Mr. Kevin Davis on your license. Based on the NRC policy, the licensee is permitted to delegate a qualified individual to act on the behalf of the Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) to manage the radiation safety program for a short period of time when the RSO is not available; however, the ultimate responsibility for the radiation safety tasks and duties remains with the RSO.

In addition, based on the licensing policy we updated the following: Item No. 9 regarding the authorized use of licensed materials, Condition No. 10 regarding the location of use, Condition Nos. 15, 16 and 17 regarding the licensed activities and possession of radioactive materials at temporary job sites, Condition No. 19 regarding the leak test requirement, and Condition No. 21 regarding the inventory requirement. We also added Condition No. 12 regarding the possession of licensed material limited by 10 CFR 30.72, "Schedule C – Quantities of radioactive materials requiring consideration of the need for an emergency plan for responding to a release."

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.


You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture. You can access the policy
