**SUBJECT: NRC REVIEW OF DIRECT LICENSE TRANSFER REQUEST AND AMENDMENT
NO. 18 TERMINATING NRC LICENSE NO. 13-32020-01**

Dear Ms. Thompson:

By letters dated May 19, July 6, July 24 and August 7, 2017 (available electronically in the Agency Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) accession numbers ML17163A405, ML17215A467, ML17206A095 and ML17226A194, respectively), Premier Healthcare, LLC submitted to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Region III Office a request for consent to a direct license transfer of NRC Materials License No. 13-32020-01 and additional information in support thereof. Based on the information provided, we understand that as a result of an acquisition of Premier Healthcare, LLC by IU Health Southern Indiana Physicians, control would be directly transferred to IU Health Southern Indiana Physicians. We further understand that this transfer will not result in any change to the licensed materials, persons using the licensed material, location of use of licensed material, or persons responsible for the licensee's radiation safety program, other than one Authorized User.

In addition, by letter dated September 5, 2017 (ML17249A925), the licensee requested the NRC to terminate its NRC License No. 13-32020-01. The final close-out survey and wipe test results were provided for the location of use at 550 Landmark Avenue, Bloomington, Indiana. The licensee confirmed that all residual licensed material used at the location of use had been removed – such that any remaining residual radioactivity in this area of use is within the limits of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) Part 20, Subpart E.

Based on the above understandings and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC staff's Safety Evaluation Report which documents the NRC staff's review of the request for consent to transfer of control, we have determined no concerns with the proposed transfer. A key consideration in this determination is that based on its review of close-out survey information, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities at the location of use does not exceed current NRC criteria. Therefore, the location of use at 550 Landmark Avenue, Bloomington, Indiana is suitable for unrestricted use. Accordingly, NRC license number 13-32020-01 is hereby terminated.
