
AFFIDAVIT OF MARSHALL GROTENHUIS ON CONTENTION 7(b)

- I, Marshall Grotenhuis, being duly sworn, state as follows:
- 1. Contention 7 states, in part:

The Steam Generator Repair Report is inadequate because:

(b) It has failed to provide an analysis for an additional commitment of land resources for the storage of the defective steam generators.






Figure 4.2 Turkey Point Plant

The Final Environmental Statement related to the steam generator repair of Turkey Point (NUREG-0743), dated March, 1981 indicates that the site for the steam generator storage compound comprises an area of approximately 2 acres located inside the Turkey Point site compound (see Figure 4.2 attached). The commitment of this total land area incident to operation of the Turkey Point Plant was previously considered in the NRC Final Environmental Statement relative to operation of the Turkey Point Plant, dated July 1972 (see p. V-1). Utilization of a portion of the plant site for steam generator storage does not alter the land use character of the site.



There is an alternative proposal to ship the replaced steam generators to the Barnwell low-level waste burial site in South Carolina. See FES, §5.5. This site is already devoted to land burial of radioactive waste and, if the replaced steam generators are accepted at the site, no additional commitment of land resources would be entailed.

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
