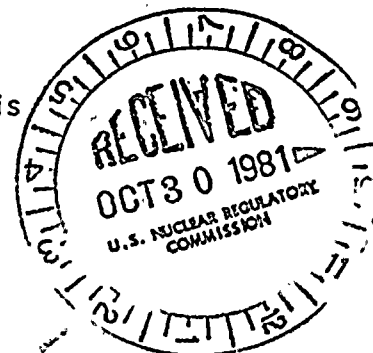

SUBJECT: TMI ACTION PLAN ITEMS I.A.1.3, I.C.5, and I.C.6 AS DESCRIBED
IN NUREG-0737

We have completed our review of the Florida Power and Light Company (FPL) referenced TMI Action Plan items for the Turkey Point Plant Unit Nos. 3 and 4. Our conclusions on each item are as follows:

Item No. I.A.1.3 Shift Manning

FPL responded to the NRC's overtime restrictions in their letter December 26, 1980, to the Director of Division of Licensing. The required implementation dates for having an administrative procedure on limited overtime was November 1, 1980. FPL has complied with these dates. The FPL Administrative Procedure 0103.2 delineates the four main overtime restrictions which are in agreement with the NUREG-0737 requirements.

We have reviewed the FPL policy on overtime restrictions for the Turkey Point Plant and find it in agreement with NUREG-0737. Based on this review we find the policy acceptable.

Item No. I.C.5 Procedure for Feedback of Operating Experience to Plant Staff

The operating experience feedback program established by FPL December 21, 1980, at Turkey Point is defined by the Corporate Power Resources Department instruction 3148, "Feedback of Operating Experience to Plant Staff" and Turkey Point Administrative Procedure 0103.15, "Operating Experience Feedback." These procedures establish a Program Administrator on the corporate staff who is in overall charge of the program. He does the initial screening of information obtained from within the FPL plants at Turkey Point and St. Lucie by way of internal assessments of off-normal occurrences, plant trips, equipment failures, Licensee Event Reports and other such information as deemed appropriate by plant management staff and department heads. He similarly screens information obtained from outside the FPL organization by way of NRC Office of Inspection and Enforcement Bulletins, and Information Notices; pertinent NRC or industrial assessments of operating experience; and Information Inc. (information provided by the Institute of Nuclear Power Operations and Nuclear Safety Analysis Center). The Quality Assurance department conducts periodic audits, to assure the feedback functions are working effectively.

Based on this review we find the FPL procedures for feedback of operating experience to the Turkey Point Plant staff, to be acceptable.

Item No. I.C.6 Guidance on Procedures for Verifying Correct Performance of Operating Activities

A review of the Turkey Point plant administrative, operating, maintenance, and surveillance procedures revealed that FPL complies with the NRC positions.

Based on this review, we find the FPL program at the Turkey Point plant to be acceptable.

Based on the results of our review, TMI Action Plan Item Nos. I.A.1.3, I.C.5 and I.C.6 are considered resolved.
