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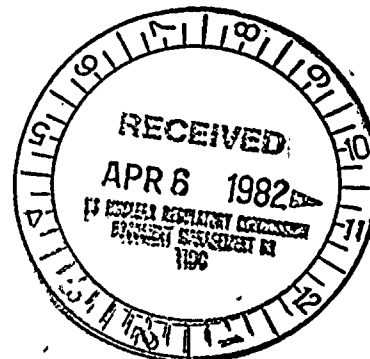

Containment High Range Radiation Monitors



In letter L-82-93 dated March 15, 1982 we provided you with the status of the containment high range radiation monitors at Turkey Point Units 3 & 4. This letter is to update you on our progress toward completing this item. Both channels of the Turkey Point Unit 3 Containment High Range Radiation Monitors are complete and operational. The Unit 3 calibration using the calibrated radiation source as discussed in the March 15, 1982 letter has been completed.

In our letter we stated that one channel of the Unit 4 monitor would have its calibration completed by April 1, 1982 and the second channel would be done during the next scheduled Unit 4 outage. Calibration of these channels require containment entry. For health physics reasons, the high range source calibration of both channels has been rescheduled so that they will be done during the next scheduled outage of sufficient duration.
