Dear Dr. Uhrig:

On April 26, 1982, we sent you a letter regarding Control Room Habitability, Action Plan item III.D.3.4 for the Turkey Point Plant Unit Nos. 3 and 4. In this letter we requested your response to three corrective actions contained in the Draft SER enclosed. The Draft SER had been telecopied on March 25, 1982. We had a conference call for clarification purposes on April 30, 1982. In the conference call we provided clarification on item (1) Redundant dampers, and (2) Radiation monitors which we confirm in the enclosure to this letter. It is our understanding that item (3) SCUBA units is adequately covered based on your staff statements that there are three units in the control room plus five additional units within 100 feet of the control room.

REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION
CLARIFICATION SUPPLEMENT TO THE APRIL 26, 1982 REQUEST

The fundamental requirements for control room habitability systems stems from GDC-19, "Control Room."

- 1). FP&L is considering a proposal to upgrade certain features of the ventilation systems associated with the dampers short of the installation of redundant dampers. Please provide drawings and descriptive details which completely describe and justify the proposed FP&L design.
- 2) Provide justification for a radiation detection and isolation system short of a system which includes radiation detectors, in the control room air intakes, which automatically isolates the control room. The justification should include radiation dose calculations which consider the time dependent transport of fission products into the control room prior to isolation.
- 3) Confirm the information provided by telephone on April 30, 1982, regarding SCUBA units available to the control room.
