Enclosed is an application from ConverDyn, dated November 16, 2017, requesting Amendment No. 07 to its existing export license XSOU8789/06. This license presently authorizes the export of 42,000,000 kilograms of natural uranium, in the form of uranium hexafluoride (UF<sub>6</sub>) to the United Kingdom, Germany, The Netherlands, and France for enrichment and ultimate use as fuel in nuclear power reactors.

The purpose of the amendment is to: 1) increase the quantity of material being shipped by 23,000,000 kilograms (kg) to reach a new cumulative total of 65,000,000 kg; 2) change the names and addresses of several "Ultimate Consignee(s) in Foreign Country(ies);" 3) replace several "Other Party(ies) to Export;" and 4) extend the expiration date from December 31, 2017 to December 31, 2025.

Assurances from EURATOM, Australia, and Canada that the material will be subject to all of the terms and conditions of an agreement for cooperation, are required. Your assistance in obtaining the necessary assurances will be appreciated.
