SUBJECT: NOTICE OF VIOLATION

NRC INSPECTION REPORT NOS. 50-335/90-02 AND 50-389/90-02

This refers to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) inspection conducted by S. A. Elrod and M. A. Scott on January 9 - February 12, 1990. The inspection included a review of activities authorized for your St. Lucie facility. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the enclosed inspection report.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observation of activities in progress.

The inspection findings indicate that certain activities appeared to violate NRC requirements. The violations, references to pertinent requirements, and elements to be included in your response are described in the enclosed Notice of Violation.

Violation B described in the enclosed Notice involves the failure of the Unit 2, 2C Auxiliary Feedwater (AFW) pump to start on demand because of inadequate procedures used in implementing the manufacturers preventive maintenance requirements. This violation has been classified a Severity Level IV based on the safety significance of the event in that two 100 percent capacity electric AFW pumps were available and functioned at the time of the turbine driven AFW pump failure. However, we emphasize that any similar violations in the future may result in stronger enforcement action. Because of a previous preventive maintenance related violation (ref. NRC Inspection Report 335,389/89-33), your response to this notice should address both the violation and the repetitive nature of the problems in this area.

In accordance with Section 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice", Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, a copy of this letter and its enclosure(s) will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room.
