SUBJECT: BOARD NOTIFICATION (BN 85-080) SPENT FUEL POOL  
 EXPANSION TURKEY POINT PLANTS UNITS 3 AND 4

In accordance with NRC procedure for Board Notification, the following information is being provided directly to the Board. The parties are being informed by copy of this memorandum.

The Region II Administrator authorized by the Director, Office of Inspection and Enforcement, has issued a Notice of Violation and Proposed Imposition of Civil Penalty to Florida Power and Light Company. The action is in relation to operation of the spent fuel pool cooling system in an improper and unanalyzed configuration at the Turkey Point Plant. The spent fuel pools are the subject of the current proceeding, ASLB No. 84-504-07 LA.

Enclosed is a copy of the Notice and Proposed Imposition of Civil Penalty. The licensee is required to respond, pursuant to 10 CFR 2.201, within 30 days. We will keep the Board and parties apprised of this matter.
